To some, the Manifest Destiny Doctrine was based on the idea that America had a divine providence. Polk "won" the election, but before he could be inaugurated, Congress voted for annexation in 1845. On the other hand, John L. Currenty, North Carolina has experienced a surge against annexation of residential areas by cities. The proposal immediately became an presidential election issue. Texas was annexed to the Union as a slave state on December 29, 1845. Slavery had always been a controversial issue that divided the United States into two different ideologies. The question at hand would deeply impact the United States for generations to come. If a challenge to the constitutionality of the move could have been made successfully at that time, there is little doubt that the leaders of the opposition would have instituted such a suit in the Supreme Court. With the U.S. The Texans forced Santa Anna to grant independence, but the Mexican government later reneged, claiming that the act had been coerced. Trouble began long before Mexico gained their independence from Spain. Although the formal transfer of government did not occur until February 19, 1846, Texas statehood dates from the 29th of December. In the end the Texans won, with the help of American supplies and men. Texas cotton attracted higher prices in Europe than Southern United States cotton. Adding to these concerns were reports that Mexico, urged on by the British, planned to attack Texas should annexation take place. Through the next several years more U.S. Nearly ninety percent of Texans wanted to become part of the United States. Tyler signed the bill, known as the Brown Resolution, as his last act in office on March 4, 1845.
